Beijing—meaning “northern capital”—is the political and cultural heart of modern China. It is an ancient city filled with world-renowned examples of Imperial Chinese town planning and architecture set within a rapidly expanding global metropolis. *Beijing Then and Now* matches historical images, including some of the very first photographic views of the capital, with specially commissioned photographs of the same sites today to explore the dramatic process of urban landscape change that has occurred overtime, documenting a city grounded in the distant past yet rushing headlong into the future.
